- Mark Davin presented an example from Pittsburgh, PA in which a tree with root rot toppled over on a residential street. The tree appeared healthy above the ground, with a fully leafed canopy and a healthy branching structure. Root damage below grade was not visible except for the presence of fruiting bodies (fungus) at grade. The structural integrity of the roots had been severely compromised by the disease. Mark also presented the recommendations of the consulting arborist that was engaged to make an assessment at the request of the committee at the January 26, 2015 meeting. Based on the arborist's report, one of the three trees in Grove #13 is recommended for removal soon. The arborist recommended maintenance pruning of crossing, dead, diseased limbs and observed some signs of root decaying fungus on the other two trees in the grove. Those two trees do not appear to be an immediate hazard to safety but will be monitored.
- The arborist also made an assessment and recommendations regarding Tree #1 (Willow oak between Scott Hall and D.H. Hill Library). The consulting arborist recommended a maintenance pruning of the tree and soil amending, but considered the tree to be in good health.
- Due to limited time, the discussion of the Morrill Drive sidewalk design was deferred until the next meeting.
- 4) Mark Weathington and Mark Davin submitted nominations for Heritage Trees. It was decided that discussion of nominations will be deferred until the next meeting.
